Advanced Learning Labs (A.L.L.) 2020-2021 Testing Registration is OPEN for current 2nd-7th graders

Elementary Program (3rd-6th):

- Students participate in regular school activities/events, but spend their instructional time with a GT Endorsed Teacher. Grade level standards are taught at a greater depth, breadth, and complexity.
- Each neighborhood school is assigned to a specific A.L.L. magnet site where students will enroll. Class placements are done based on students from those feeder schools. Applying for a different location is not recommended. See this list for magnet site assignments. Parents are responsible for transportation to and from the magnet site program.

Middle School Program (7th-8th):

- Advanced courses with GT endorsed teachers are offered in English and history at every middle school
- Advanced courses are offered in science at American Fork, Frontier, Lehi Jr., Pleasant Grove, Mountain Ridge, Timberline, Vista Heights, Lake Mountain, and Willowcreek (New programs are possible at other schools but not confirmed at this time.)
- Grade level curriculum is taught at a deeper and more rigorous level

Placement for the program is determined using multiple evaluations. Top scoring students are offered placement into the program. Possible indicators to consider prior to having your student tested include:

- The student's Utah State SAGE/RISE test scores are a 4 in Language Arts, Math and Science.
- The student's WIDA growth scores are higher than expected for students of the same age and level
- The student is reading two or more grade levels above their current grade.
- The current classroom teacher has suggested during a Parent/Teacher Conference that the student could benefit from a more complex or in-depth curriculum as offered in an A.L.L. program.
- The student learns quickly, recalls information effortlessly, is curious, self-motivated, works independently and typically remains committed to a task until its completion.
- The student exhibits satisfactory to outstanding citizenship in both attitude and behavior.
- The student has good school attendance and is committed to the program for two years.
- The student completes homework in a timely manner and has task commitment for long-term projects.
- The student initiates his/her own learning through questioning and research.
