Minutes

Welcome: Dan Griffey

Introductions: all members of committee

Election of Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary: led by Dan Griffey

Tiffany Sherbel nominated, seconded and unanimously voted in favor of serving as Committee Chair

Marla Allred nominated, seconded and unanimously voted in favor of serving as Committee Vice Chair

Anjeelee Norton nominated, seconded and unanimously voted in favor of serving as Committee Secretary

Review of 2016-2017 expenditures: led by Dan Griffey

Learned where 2016-2017 school year monies were spent and that we will be receiving more money for 2018-2019, approximately \$52,000.

Mr. Griffey will be putting together stake holder report and we will then look at and approve it as a council

By-laws: We currently have none. Tiffany Sherbel to draft Google Doc and send via email for input and review. Meeting was set for November to review by-laws and vote on them.

Barratt boundaries to receive 90 new homes with new development East of 1100 East.

21st Century Learning: led by Dan Griffey

Teachers to be trained to help children work better in groups – economy headed in that direction, 20% of jobs these children will eventually fill have not been invented/created yet. Discussion vs. Dialogue to be discussed and taught to children

Sage Results: led by Dan Griffey

Barratt Elementary is one of only nine schools in the district that received “A” grade, learned this looks at students in 1’s and 2’s who moved to 3’s and 4’s.

Diebels saw a large discrepancy in kindergartners’ scores from beginning of year to end of year (scores dropped.) District is looking into testing methods being the cause. Learned new testing company to replace Sage within next year or two.

Classes receive 3 aides per grade level, 3 times/week to review things on Core for kids who are not where they need to be – “Target Time.” With next year’s increased budget this may be a good place to put more money (more bodies in classrooms for more individualized help for kids falling behind.)

Expenditures for next year: led by Dan Griffey

New district program to fund Chromebooks for upper grades, no longer funded by Trustland monies. The school (and possibly trust lands monies) will still be responsible for 3rd grade and, if we decide, 2nd grade. Target ration of 1 Chromebook per 2 kids.
