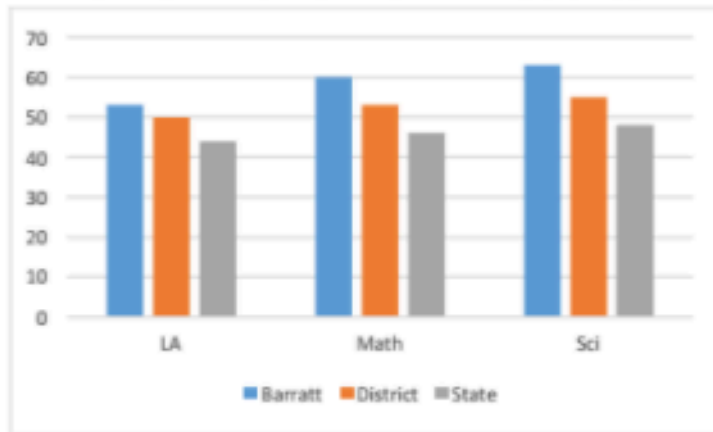

SAGE 2016-2017 Results



Highlights:

Our 6th grade scored at the top of the district: 1st in Science, 2nd in Math, and 5th in Language Arts.

Barratt received an A grade from the State School Grading System. Only 9% of Elementary and Jr. High Schools statewide received an A grade. Grades are based on 2 factors: the number of students testing at a proficient level on SAGE and the number of students whose SAGE scores show improvement over the previous year.



School Improvement

Plan for 2017-2018

The school will be using Trust Land funds to increase student learning in reading. Money will be spent in several ways as determined by the grades after collaborating with and approval by the school community council.

Grade K-3--will use reading/math aides hired by the school and trained to tutor individual and small groups of students in reading and math. Special emphasis will be placed on sight words, phonics, fluency and comprehension. In addition to that students are fluent in math according to grade level standards. The tutoring students receive will be in addition to their regular classroom instruction.

Grades 4-6 will use reading/math aides hired by the school and trained to tutor individual and small groups of students in reading and math. Special emphasis will be placed on fluency and comprehension. Also key concepts in math are learned.

Results from 2016-2017

In grades K-3, 18% of those that were below grade level rose to above grade level and in grades 4-6, 23% of those who were not previously proficient according to the SAGE test became proficient in Language Arts and 20% in Math.

21st Century School

Barratt applied for and was selected to be an early part of the roll out of this statewide program. It includes training on best practices for using technology in the classroom. By fall of 2019, we will have 1 Chromebook for every 2 students in the upper grades. Training also covers teaching the Four C's: collaboration, communication, creativity, and critical thinking.
